Put your best effort into everything you do within the school

For example

Do...

- Try to answer a question in class, even if you are unsure about the answer.
- Attempt all homework and class work.

For example

Do not...

- Talk when the teacher is talking.
- Distract others from learning.
- Forget your equipment.

Treat everyone in the school community equally

For example

Do...

- Be friendly.
- Treat others how you want to be treated.
- Be polite to guests, introduce yourself.

For example

Do not...

- Pick on other pupils.
- Use bad language.
- Aggravate others.

Do not be part of any bullying

For example

Do...

- Tell a member of staff or Peer Mentor if you see someone who is upset.
- Tell someone your problems, do not bottle them up!
- Call people by their 'real' name - they might not like a nickname.

For example

Do not...

- Exclude others from conversations.
- Join in with name calling.
- Laugh when a person is impersonating someone.
- Threaten or intimidate others.

Accept the consequences of your actions

For example

Do...

- Own up - no matter how worried you are.
- Attend a detention if you are given one.
- Remember :-
Choice, Decision, Consequence.

For example

Do not...

- Talk when the teacher is talking.
- Run away.
- Blame others.
- Do not make up excuses about homework.

Understand that pupils, parents and all staff are part of the same team

For example

Do...

- Tell any staff or your parents about any problems or concerns you have.
- Make sure you pass on any notices and letters to parents and staff.

Do not...

- Leave your report card or school letters in the bottom of your bag.
- Hide information about school from your parents.

Consider other people's views even if you do not agree with them

For example

Do...

- Allow someone to finish talking before putting your point across.
- Try to understand that 'your way' may not always be the 'only way'.

For example

Do not...

- Discriminate against others.
- Get aggressive when discussing something you disagree with.

Wear the school uniform correctly

For example

Do...

- Bring a coat, but take it off inside.
- Take pride in your uniform; try to keep it clean, free from mud and damage.

For example

Do not...

- Make holes or tears in your sweatshirt.
- Wear trainers unless taking part in sport.
- Wear your polo shirt over another T shirt.

Respect all the school's facilities

For example

Do...

- Take care of ICT equipment and report any damage.
- Leave the toilets and social areas tidy.

For example

Do not...

- Use the internet for looking at items that are not related to the lesson.
- Graffiti any part of school or books.

Help to maintain a pleasant school free of litter

For example

Do...

- Pick up ANY loose litter, even if it is not yours.
- Put litter in your pocket until you find a bin.
- Use the bins, both inside and outside the building.

For example

Do not...

- Chew gum.
- Play with rubbish, kick bottles around.
- Ignore it if a friend drops litter, ask them to pick it up instead.

- Hold the doors open for others.
- Take care when walking in the corridors at lunchtime as well as during lesson change over.

For example

Do not...

- Hang around in the corridors at lunchtime.
- Run inside the building.
