

Pupil Progress and Attainment Information 2019

As a part of our rigorous and on-going self-evaluation, we analyse how well our pupils at Cirencester Deer Park School do in comparison to their peers.

Below are some headline statistics from the GCSE results for summer 2019 with comparisons to results for Gloucestershire and the whole of England:

Our school's provisional Progress 8 measure, which tracks the progress of pupils in comparison to other pupils nationally with the same KS2 attainment across a range of subjects, was +0.14. The national average Progress 8 figure was -0.03 and the average for a secondary schools in Gloucestershire was +0.01. This places us as an average school for progress. Progress was particularly good in Maths, Humanities and Science (and the 'Ebacc Bucket'). This continues the schools' trend for delivering progress at or above the national average.

Our school's Attainment 8 measure, which is a score based on how well pupils have performed in up to 8 qualifications including Maths, English, 3 English Baccalaureate subjects plus 3 other approved qualifications, is 50.5. This is above the national average for schools (46.5) and the LEA average of 49.5.

Another main measure is the percentage of pupils achieving a 'strong' pass (9-5 grade) in both English and Maths (known as 'Basics'). For Cirencester Deer Park School this was 53.1%, well above the national average which was 43% and the LEA average of 47.5%.

A pupil is considered to have entered for the English Baccalaureate if they entered for qualifications in English, maths, sciences, a language and either history or geography. The English Baccalaureate (EBacc) is not a test or qualification; it is a measure used to provide information about a particular range of qualifications. 44% of pupils were entered for the Ebacc, which was above the national average of 40% and the LEA average of 34.5%.

The Average Points Score achieved for the 'English Baccalaureate' was 4.48. This was above all schools nationally (4.06) and for schools in Gloucestershire (4.32).

These results demonstrate that Cirencester Deer Park School provides opportunity for pupils to excel in their studies. Our next step is to improve further. We have identified areas we can improve and our current pupils in Year 11 are focusing hard on maximising their potential. At Cirencester Deer Park School we challenge all of our pupils to achieve more than they first think is possible and be the best they can be every day.

Pupil Destinations

Of the pupils who studied at Cirencester Deer Park School until summer 2017 96% went on to education or employment. This figure is above the national average and LEA average of 94%.

We continue to work to ensure all pupils progress to education or employment, in accordance with government guidelines, to further prepare our young people for working life in modern Britain.
