

Education



Amongst those who have also benefited from HelpMadina are the local schools.

Education is key to improved health for an individual as well as for the community.

In addition to funds received for healthcare provision, HelpMadina has also been given funds from local schools in Gloucestershire to help village schools in the Madina area.



The funds are being used to restore small village schools which provide educational facilities for children of many ages. The whole of the community from children to elders work together with building materials paid for by HelpMadina. Kafitori village school now has new floors, windows, doors, blackboards and desks.

Water wells and sanitation



Water Wells

The township of Madina has an approximate population of 5,000. There are also many surrounding villages. Whilst working in the Madina Health Clinic, it soon became apparent that all was not right with the water supply. Patients with gastroenteric conditions were questioned and almost all were drinking untreated water from the nearby streams.

Football



Football is massive in Sierra Leone. It is a healthy distraction from all the hardships that young people face, and it also bring communities together. There is a very strong following of the Premier League in England and all the matches are shown live.

For several years HelpMadina have been distributing football kit and equipment that has been donated by professional and amateur football clubs. The list of donors is long, but includes Cheltenham and Swindon Town, Everton, Watford, Forest Green Rovers, Fairford and even Aresenal. These donations have helped many small village teams in the Madina area.

In addition to kit, HelpMadina have assisted with providing football coaching and the planning of tournaments.

The elderly are often the forgotten. They can be isolated and left without a family. This makes them highly vulnerable with many unmet needs regarding health, food, clothing, etc.

HelpMadina created the first register of elderly patients. There are approximately 80-100 people on the register at any given time. Assistance is given to these elderly in the following areas:

Health Care: Each person on the register is entitled to free health care. This will include general medical health, long term conditions management and eye screening. The cost of all drugs is covered.

Nutrition: $\frac{1}{2}$ a bag of rice is given to each person on the register every 6 months. This goes some way in providing nutritional support.

Clothing: Due to lack of money, the elderly vulnerable rely on cast off clothing which are often ill fitting and in a state of disrepair. This adds to their lack of dignity. HelpMadina provides each individual on the register with cloth which is made into clothing by a local tailor.



Welcome to Dollar Street




