We would recommend the grid method for multiplying numbers.
The grid method is a visual way of multiplying two numbers. Each digit in the number is divided into its place value column.

For example, calculate $37 \times 58$ :
37 is split into 30 ( 3 tens) plus 7 ( 7 units) and 58 is split into 50 ( 5 tens) plus 8 ( 8 units).

| $\times$ | $\mathbf{3 0}$ (3 tens) | $\mathbf{7}$ (7 units) |
| :---: | :--- | :--- |
| $\mathbf{5 0}$ (5 tens) | $50 \times 30=1500$ | $50 \times 7=350$ |
| $\mathbf{8}$ (8 units) | $8 \times 30=240$ | $8 \times 7=56$ | Then you add up the partial products: 1500
