

Multiplication



Method

We would recommend the **grid method** for multiplying numbers.

The **grid method** is a visual way of multiplying two numbers. Each digit in the number is divided into its place value column.

For example, calculate 37×58 :

37 is split into 30 (3 tens) plus 7 (7 units) and 58 is split into 50 (5 tens) plus 8 (8 units).

\times	30 (3 tens)	7 (7 units)
50 (5 tens)	$50 \times 30 = 1500$	$50 \times 7 = 350$
8 (8 units)	$8 \times 30 = 240$	$8 \times 7 = 56$

Then you add up the partial products:

$$\begin{array}{r} 1500 \\ 350 \\ 240 \\ + 56 \\ \hline 2146 \\ 11 \end{array}$$
